

Reading "I was scared" and "I was told scary things" wasn't enough for me to really feel like she had a reason to up and leave the love of her life with no discussion She wasn't in danger, or had seen any frightening things. She supposedly went totally off this one person's say so. I realize she was young but really? I never really felt the love. Tati told me that a hundred times but I didn't understand why. We are told that Kirill (isn't that a sea creature?) was devastated when he thought Tati was dead but I really didn't feel it. Again, maybe if we had a bit more backstory instead of the "I was devastated" and "I mourned" written a few times throughout the book I would feel it. I also felt that Kirill's change of heart was WAY too abrupt. Way, way too abrupt. He went from "I hate her and will never trust her" to "I love her and I have to put it behind me" for no reason. Again, I didn't feel the love. Kirill told us that he loved her before because she was "pure, naive". That was it. He loved her because she was a virgin? That is it? I have to say I was a bit scared when I realized that this author is okay with cheating. One of the male characters early on in the book reminds the room of men, including Kirill, that he cheated on his wife and she was devastated. This is a character from a previous book in this series.
