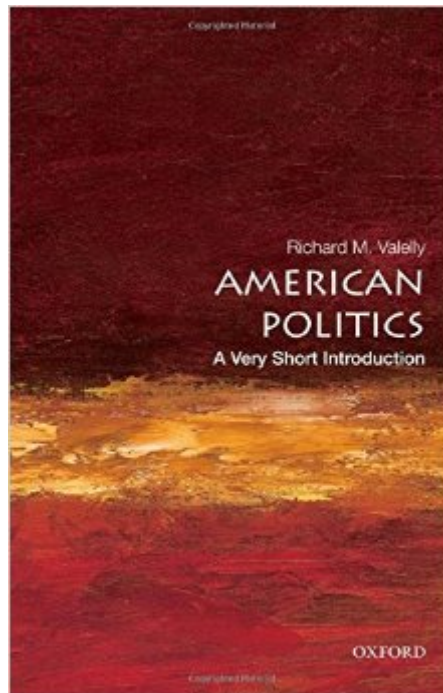

Synopsis

American politics seems to grow more contentious and complicated by the day, and whether American democracy works well is hotly debated. He offers as well an original analysis of the evolution of the American presidency and a fascinating chapter on the effects of public polling on political decision-making and voter representation. Valelly shows that the American political system is, and always has been, very much a work in progress--unfolding within, and also constantly updating, an eighteenth-century constitutional framework. In a refreshingly balanced and judicious assessment, he explores the strengths of American democracy while candidly acknowledging both gaps in representation and the increasing income inequality have sparked protest and intense public discussion. Finally, Valelly considers the remarkable persistence, for more than two centuries, of the basic constitutional forms established in 1787, despite the dramatic social changes that have reshaped virtually all aspects of American life. For anyone wishing to understand the nuts and bolts of how our political system works--and sometimes fails to work--this Very Short Introduction is the very best place to start.

I was required to read this book for a short session university course. The only reason I can think of for the professor picking it is that he must be a friend of the author. This book is absolutely useless in every sense of the word.-The author's grammar, diction, and phrasing are among the most atrocious I've ever seen in published writing. Had this book been run by me (or any other competent, English-speaking editor) in manuscript form, there would have been more red ink than black by the time I was done.-The ideas and "facts" put forward in this book with regard to the mechanics of how the US government operates are overly simplistic to the degree one would use when talking to an 8 year old. The book is completely lacking in nuance, depth, and terminology. Most of its explanations read like what one would find in an elementary school textbook.-The entire text is riddled with ideological statements, ridiculous generalizations, and laughably unrealistic best-case-scenario situations. Absolutely no attempt is made to dissect why political disagreements take place or the fact that sometimes one side or the other may be in the right about a particular issue. It just makes absurd claims about what a land of compromise America is.Do not buy this book. If you want to learn about American politics, pick up a newspaper and read through a few wikipedia articles, they contain more useful information in each paragraph than this book does per chapter.
