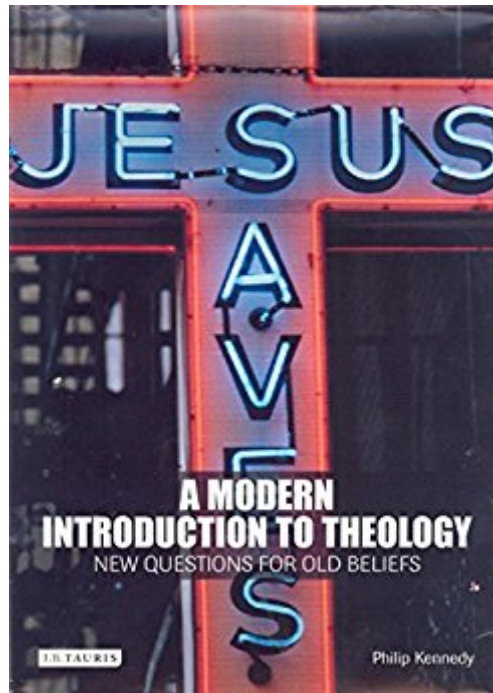

Kennedy argues that there are three pillars of Christianity's conventional that account for human destiny in relation to God and the doctrines of humanity engineered by Adam and Eve. The fall, cross, and judgment is thus the archetypal Christian story of humanity's relation to God. In this grand doctrinal scheme of God, Christ, and Salvation, it is crucial to note a great deal of spatial imagery. Kennedy challenges the real world with intense questions in a modern era.
