
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How English Works: A Linguistic Introduction (3rd Edition)

I purchased this book for a linguistics class. The class, admittedly, was not that exciting. And I only did the reading to complete the assignments. Compared to most grammar books I've encountered, however, this one did not put me to sleep immediately. The authors explain English rules very clearly, and the chapters cover almost all aspects of the language I can think of.Now, with my M.A. completed, I've begun teaching English to non-native speakers. I realized very quickly though that while I understood a lot on class design, assessment, and second language acquisition principles, my grammar knowledge was woefully inadequate. So, I went back to this text and began reading it to understand English so I could design relevant activities and provide clear explanations to my

students. Since then, the book has been immensely helpful. The sections on English syntax have been especially great for helping me understand how nouns, adjectives, verbs, and adverbs function and change in different contexts AND WHY. This last part, of realizing that all of English's idiosyncracies actually affect meaning is what makes this book 5 stars. It's great at explaining why English is as it is. As a native speaker of English, this book hasn't transformed my linguistic usage or accuracy, but it has helped me identify what linguistic problems non-native speakers are having, and design activities and instruction to help them. For it's clarity in explaining how English works, and it's helpfulness in explaining why it works as it does, I give it 5 stars. If you're planning on teaching English, especially to non-native speakers, I highly recommend this text. Note: It doesn't have activities for you to use, and it may not be a great text for having your students read, but it's engaging and very clear in explaining the principles and reasoning behind English, allowing you to design activities that bring out those points.Best regards,Devin
